

Brain, The Inside Story Coming To The Museum February 16th



Following the success of the *Da Vinci, the Genius Within*, the next amazing blockbuster exhibition coming to the Museum is *Brain: The Inside Story* coming to us from the American Museum of Natural History, New York City. Members will receive free access to this exhibition. Arriving in February, it is filled with digital interactive experiences that will engage you as you explore your senses, emotions and thoughts, and learn about the science of brain development and the brain of the 21st century.

The five themes included in the exhibition are:

- Your Sensing Brain. How does the brain interpret what we see, hear, touch, smell and taste? Exhibits demonstrate how the brain processes sensory data.
- Your Emotional Brain. How do humans process emotions differently from other animals?
 Try to build a brain and learn what each region of the brain does.
- Your Thinking Brain. Explore through hands-on interactives how language, memory, and reasoning are essential to the way we think.
- Your Changing Brain. The things we do change our brains by making neural connections. Play brain-training games and discover how these exercises keep the brain sharp.
- Your 21st-Century Brain. How do new insights and technologies change how we treat disease? Explore new technologies and see real scans of the brain in action in the Brain Lounge.

Drugs: Costs and Consequences Opening January 26th



Drugs: Costs and Consequences is an educational exhibit from the Drug Enforcement Administration Museum that began a national tour in 2002. Visitors will also gain an understanding of the environmental effects of illegal drugs and what law enforcement, drug

abuse education, and treatment are doing to break the deadly cycle of drug abuse and drug-related violence in America.

With newly expanded content and a section specific to the current illegal drugs statistics in New Mexico, the exhibit explains the science behind drug addiction and presents both a global and historical overview of the many costs and consequences of drug abuse on individuals, families and communities across American Society and the world.

Premiering at the New Mexico Museum of Natural History and Science January 26, 2019, the exhibit is free for members or available with museum admission for visitors.

Gordodon Fossil Now on Exhibit at the Museum!



Gordodon is a new, sail-backed reptile based on an incomplete skeleton found in Permian age rocks (about 300 million years old) near Alamogordo, New Mexico. The unique structure of the skull, jaws and teeth of Gordodon indicate it was a surprisingly specialized plant eater (herbivore). Previously, such specialized plant eating was not known in reptiles older than about 200 million years. So, Gordodon rewrites the books by pushing back our understanding of the evolution of such specialized herbivory by about 100 million years.

Back to Bones



New Mexico is well-known for its rich fossil record spanning some 500 million years. Of particular note are the many unique fossil vertebrates that include fishes, amphibians, reptiles (turtles, dinosaurs, and birds) and mammals. This exhibit displays some of the recent discoveries and iconic fossils from the 'Land of Enchantment' that were collected by the New Mexico Museum of Natural History and Science.
